Quilt Size: 55 1/2" x 63"

Skill level: Beginner

Materials:

(yardage requirements based on 42" wide fabric)

1 5/8 yards of Pattern 90028-1 for outer border
3/4 yard of Pattern 90041-11 for sashing
1 yard of Pattern 90020-1 for center rectangle*
3/4 yard of Pattern 90042-4 for four-patch blocks and binding
3/8 yard of Pattern 90041-6 for four-patch blocks
3/8 yard of Pattern 90041-2 for center rectangle border
1 fat quarters (18" x 21") each of Patterns
90021-1M, 90022-1M, 90023-1M, 90025-1M, 90027-2, 90030-1M 90033-1M, 90034-1M,
90035-1M, 90037-1M for blocks*

3 3/4 yards of fabric for backing
58" x 66" piece of *Hobbs Heirloom* batting
Mettler Machine embroidery thread to match

*You may need additional yardage to "fussy cut" specific motifs.

Cutting

From Pattern 90028-1, cut:

2 strips, 6 3/4" x 49 1/2" (elephants and monkeys)
2 strips 7 1/2" x 43 1/2" (giraffes and cat faces)

From Pattern 90041-11, cut:

2 strips, 1 1/4" x 42"; crosscut into 8 rectangles 1 1/4" x 6 1/2"
11 strips, 1 1/2" x 42" Join 7 strips end to end to make one continuous strip; crosscut into 2 strips 1 1/2" x 41 1/2", 2 strips 1 1/2" x 43 1/2", 2 strips 1 1/2" x 47 1/2". Crosscut the remaining strips into 10 rectangles, 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" and 2 rectangles, 1 1/2" x 33 1/2".

From Pattern 90020-1, cut:

1 rectangle, 17 1/2" x 23 1/2"
2 squares, 6 1/2" x 6 1/2"
4 rectangles, 6 3/4" x 7 1/2"

From Pattern 90041-2, cut:

2 strips, 2 1/2" x 23 1/2"
2 strips, 2 1/2" x 21 1/2"

From Pattern 90042-4, cut:

10 strips, 2" x 42"

From Pattern 90041-6, cut:

4 strips, 2" x 42"

From each of the 10 fat quarters, cut:

2 squares, 6 1/2" x 6 1/2"

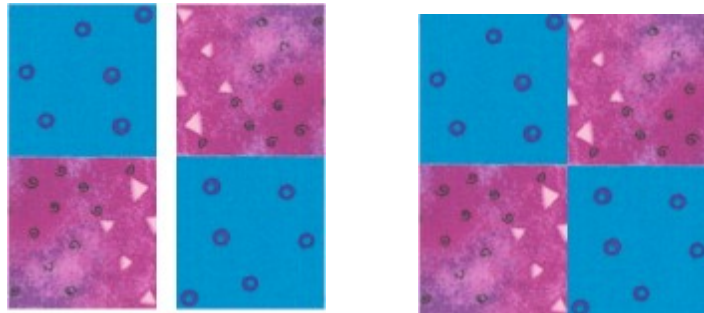
Directions

1. Sew four of the 2" strips cut from Patterns 90042-4 and 90041-6 together to make 4 strip sets. Press toward the blue strip. Cut each strip set into 2" sections. Cut 72 segments.

2. Sew two 2" sections together to make a four-patch unit. Press. Make 36 units.



3. Join the 2 1/2" x 23 1/2" strips from Pattern 90041-2 to the sides of the center rectangle. Press towards the strips. Join the 2 1/2" x 21 1/2" strips to the top and bottom of the center rectangle. Press towards the strips.

4. For the four-patch border, join nine four-patch units to make a border strip. Border strips should measure 27 1/2" long. Make 4 strips.

5. Sew a border strip to each side of the center unit. Press towards the center unit. Sew a border strip to the top and bottom of the center unit. Press towards the center unit.



6. Join five 6 1/2" squares and four 1 1/4" x 6 1/2" sashing strips to make one row. Press towards the sashing strips. Join a 1 1/2" x 33 1/2" black sashing strip to each row. Press towards the strip. Make two rows. Sew one row to each side of the center unit. Press towards the strip.
7. Join six 6 1/2" squares and five 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" sashing strips to make one row. Press towards the sashing strips. Join a 1 1/2" x 41 1/2" black sashing strip to each row. Press towards the strip. Make two rows. Sew the top and bottom strips to the center unit. Press towards the strip.
8. Pin one 1 1/2" x 47 1/2" border strip to each of the side edges, match centers and ends; ease any fullness as you pin the rest of the strip. Sew each strip and press towards the strip.
9. Pin one 1 1/2" x 43 1/2" border strip to the top and bottom edges, match centers and ends; ease any fullness as you pin the rest of the strip. Sew each strip and press towards the strip.
10. Mark the center of the outer border strips and the quilt top. Pin a border strips to each of the side edges, match centers and ends; ease any fullness as you pin the rest of the strip. Sew each strip and press the seams toward the border.
11. Join one corner rectangle to each end of the top border strip. Press towards the border strip. Repeat for the bottom border strip. Mark the center of the border strips and the quilt top. Pin the border strips to the top and bottom edges, match centers, seams and ends. Ease any fullness as you pin the rest of the strip. Sew each strip and press the seams toward the border.
12. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing. Quilt as desired. Bind the edges.

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
