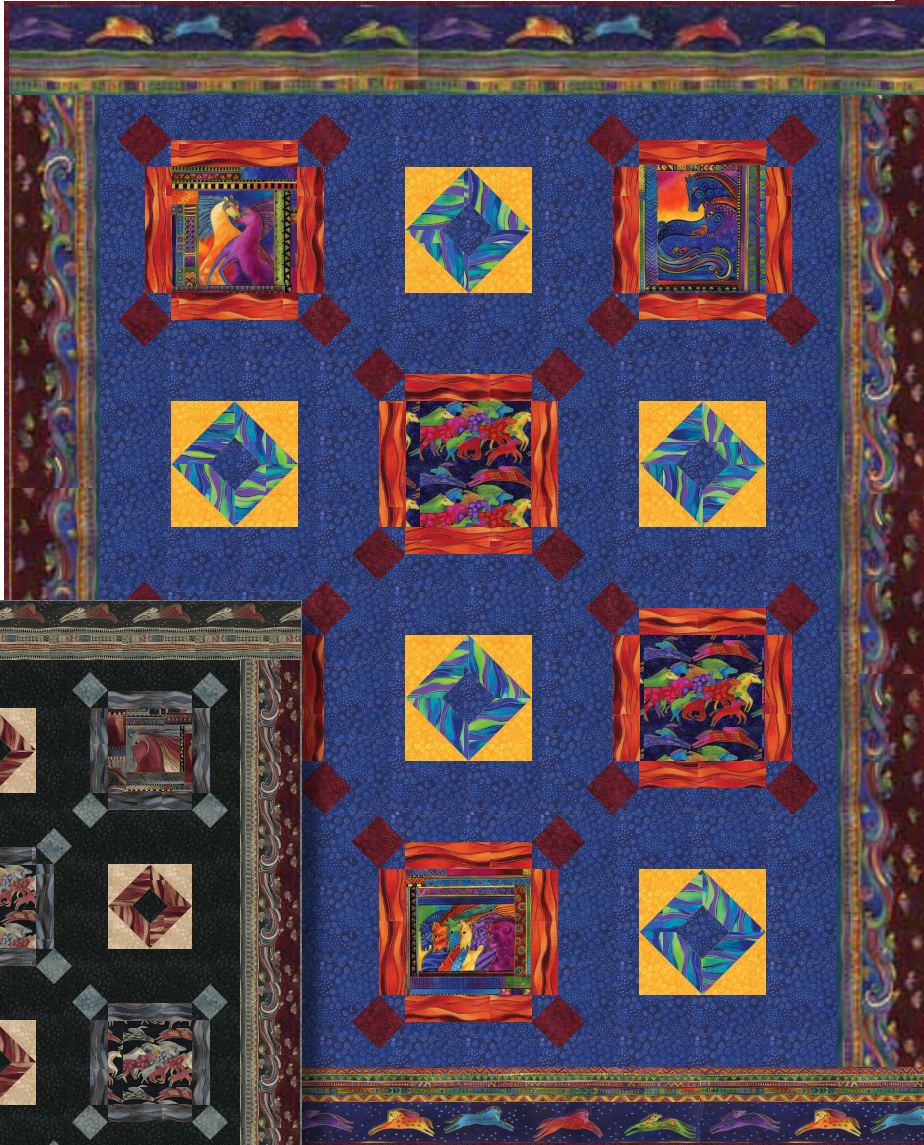

Dancing Horses

Materials

Bright Version (Earth Version in parentheses)

Yardages based on 42" wide fabric

1 panel or 1 fat half-yard

Running Blocks Bright-Y0414-30M;
(Earth-Y0414-6M)

1-5/8 yds Large Stripe Bright-Y0415-31M;
(Earth-Y0415-6M) – Border

1/4 yd Medium Horses/Navy-Y0419-31M;
(Black-Y0419-3M)

1/2 yd Red/Orange Stripe-Y0416-37M;
(Gray Stripe-Y0416-6M)

3/8 yd Blue Stripe-Y0416-30M;
(Brown Stripe-Y0416-48M)

1-3/4 yds Dk Blue Tonal-Y0417-31;
(Black Tonal-Y0417-3)

3/4 yd Wine Tonal-Y0417-48;
(Gray Tonal-Y0417-6) – includes binding

3/8 yd Yellow Tonal-Y0417-10;
(Tan Tonal-Y0417-11)

4 yds Backing of choice

Cut the Fabrics

WOF = Width of Fabric

LOF = Length of Fabric

From Running Blocks Bright (Earth):

3 – 7-1/2" squares, centered on desired images

From Large Stripe Bright (Earth):

4 – 4-1/2" x LOF strips, fussy cut, carefully centering on portions pictured

From Medium Horses/Navy (Black):

3 – 7-1/2" squares, centered on desired images

From Red/Orange Stripe (Gray Stripe):

2 – 7-1/2" x WOF strips, recut into:
24 – 2" x 7-1/2" rectangles –see Diagram A below

From Blue Stripe (Brown Stripe):

12 – 4-3/8" squares

From Dk Blue Tonal (Black Tonal):

2 – 7-1/2" x WOF strips, recut into:
24 – 2" x 7-1/2" rectangles –see Diagram A below

7 – 3-1/2" x WOF strips, recut into:
12 – 3-1/2" x 13-1/2" rectangles
12 – 3-1/2" x 7-1/2" rectangles

6 – 2" x WOF strips, recut into:
120 – 2" squares

5 – 1-1/2" x WOF strips (inner border)

From Wine Tonal (Gray Tonal):

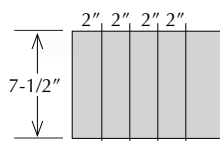
24 – 3-1/2" squares

6 – 2-1/2" x WOF strips

From Yellow Tonal (Tan Tonal):

12 – 4-3/8" squares

Bright Version (Earth Version in parentheses)

Making the Framed Horses Blocks:

1. Place a 7-1/2 x 2" Red/Orange (Gray) Stripe rectangle right sides together with a 7-1/2 x 2" Dk Blue (Black) Tonal rectangle. Sew with 1/4" seam allowance on one long edge. Press. Repeat to make a total of 4 pieced strips.
2. Pencil a diagonal line on the reverse side of a 2" Dk Blue (Black) Tonal square. Place it right sides together on one corner of a Wine (Gray) Tonal 3-1/2" square (fig 1). Sew on the line, trim to 1/4" seam allowance and press the corner out (fig 2). Repeat on the other three corners (fig 3). Repeat to make a total of four squares.
3. Sew two of the pieced squares to the ends of a pieced strip from Step 1 (fig 4). Press toward the pieced strips. Repeat to make two strips with square corner ends.
4. Sew the remaining two pieced strips from Step 1 to left and right sides of a 7-1/2" square of Running Blocks, placing the stripe fabric next to the center square (fig 5). Press seams toward the outside.
5. Sew the two strips with square corner ends from Step 4 to the top and bottom sides of the block. The Running Block should measure 13-1/2". Press seams toward the outside.
6. Repeat Steps 1 through 6 to make a total of three blocks with Running Blocks and three blocks with Medium Horses/Navy (Black) center squares.

Making the Squares-on-Point Blocks:

1. Pencil a diagonal line on the reverse side of a 4-3/8" Blue (Brown) Stripe square. To make the squares as shown in the quilt, place each stripe square horizontally (fig 6) and draw the line from the lower right corner to the upper left corner. (For left-handers, place the stripe vertically and draw from the lower left to the upper right corner.)
2. Place the Blue (Brown) Stripe square right sides together with a 4-3/8" Yellow Tonal (Tan Tonal) square. Sew 1/4" away from the line on each side of the line. Cut on the line. Press the two squares open. They should measure 4". Repeat to make four pieced squares.
3. Pencil a diagonal line on the reverse side of a 2" Dk Blue (Black) Tonal square and place right sides together on the striped corner of one of the squares from Step 2. Sew across on the diagonal. Trim to 1/4" seam allowance and press the corner out. Repeat with the remaining squares from Step 2.
4. Sew the squares from Step 3 together into a square with the Dk Blue (Black) corners in the center (fig 7). The square should measure 7-1/2".
5. Sew a 3-1/2" x 7-1/2" Dk Blue (Black) Tonal rectangle to the right and left sides of the pieced square from Step 4. Press seams to the outside.
6. Sew a 3-1/2" x 13-1/2" Dk Blue (Black) Tonal rectangle to the top and bottom sides of the square. Press seams to the outside. The block should measure 13-1/2".
7. Repeat Steps 1 through 6 to make six total squares.

Assemble the Quilt:

1. Arrange the blocks as shown in the colored image. Sew four rows of three blocks. Press seams toward the squares-on-point blocks.
2. Sew the rows together to make the quilt center.
3. Measure the quilt center from top to bottom. Sew three 1-1/2" strips Dk Blue (Black) Tonal strips together end to end and trim two strips to this length. Sew to the left and right sides of the quilt center. Press out toward the border strips.
4. Measure the quilt from side to side. Trim two 1-1/2" strips of the Dk Blue (Black) Tonal strip to this measurement. Sew to the top and bottom edges of the quilt. Press out toward the border strips.
5. Measure the quilt center from top to bottom. Trim two strips of the Large Stripe to this length and sew to the left and right side edges. Press out. Measure the quilt from side to side and trim the remaining two strips of the Large Stripe to this measurement. Sew to the top and bottom edges of the quilt. Press out.
6. Layer and quilt as desired. Bind and label to finish.

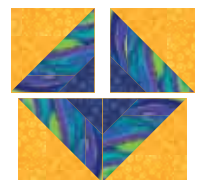
